Prepare
Maintain Your Car: Check your battery, tire tread, keep your windows clear, put no-freeze fluid in the washer reservoir, and check you anti-freeze.

Have On Hand: flashlight, jumper cables, abrasive material (sand, kityligher veron floor masts), shovel, snowbush and ice scraper. Warming devices (like candles, blankets) for long trips add food, water, medication and a cell phone for emergencies.

s. Stopped or Stalled? Stay w Stopped or Stalled? Stay with your car, don 'tower exert yourself, and put bright marking objects on your antenga or windows. If you run your car, clear the exhaust pipe and run it just enough to stay warm.

Plan Your Route: Allow plenty of

time (Check the weather and leave early if necessary), be familiar with the maps, directions and let others know your mute and arrival time. Protect Yourself

Buckle Up and use child safety

seats properly.

Never place an infant seat in front of an airbag.

Children 12 and under are much
