at \$647,000. The jail receives other monies from the state, but the lion's share is for keeping the state prisoners. That budget includes money for all debt service and jail opeations

expense.

Miller said that he based his budget on keeping fifty state prisoners and anything over that number would be "gravy for the county."

"When we keep as many as 89

be "gravy for the county."

"When we keep as many as 89 prisoners about 20 of them have to sleep on the floor on cots, but the state allows for that so we are going to try and keep around 60 state prisoners all the time," Miller said.

The Jailer also said the local Detention Center would begin keeping some federal prisoners after the Detention Center is inspected by

the Detention Center is inspected by federal officials..

"We are ready for any inspection and the federal government pays approximately \$35.00 a day to keep their prisoners," Miller said.

"It will take a while to get back on our feet financially because of the time the jail was closed and because

of the many past due bills that are still owed, but we are certainly on our way," Miller said.
Miller said that he appreciates the efforts of the fiscal court and local law enforcement officials who have been very cooperative since the Detention Center opened on Sentember 20

September 20.
Currently the Detention Center employees 13 full and part timb deputies and two cooks.


