Which Schools Participate? Most universities, colleges, trade and vocational schools participate in the Federal Family Education Loan Program. EFG will confirm your school's participation at: 1-800-480-0392. The call is free.
How Much Can A Parent Bor-row?

You may be eligible to borrow up to the total cost of your child's education including tuition, room and board, books, travel and administrative fees.
