The House version of the budget for the next two fiscal years includes inconsequested by the Governor, local communities and citizens. Funding appropriations, will support continuate programs for younger children, higher and more equiable pay scales; additional funding and programs for the mentally dissibled citizens of the state; and economic and community development projects across the state. The passage of HB 144 would expand opportunities and provide meaningful funding for those of our citizens and their families who carry the extra challenge of mental retarding and developmental disabilities. HB 57 will end "phone jail" in state agencies. The bill, thought to have died without passage at one point in the Session, was revived and passed the House this week. It directs state agencies to reduce their reliance on automated slephen element on automated slephen element of the personal control of the present answering of statetelephones. In those cases where automated machines where sutomated machines must be used, the phone menu is to include an operator option in the first part of the menu.

HB 221 creates a plan for developing abandoned railroad tracks and turning them into recreational and educational byways.

HB 321 provides an option for college students with disabilities to appeal school policies forcing residence in a school facility, while HB 322 tightens security against campus crime.

HB 745 proposes to amend the Kentucky Constitution to provide for a statewide referendum on whether to require a statewide container de-

to require a statewide container de-posit program.

HB 750, addressing Gubernato-ral eléction campaign finance, was passed by a weak vote of 50-41 due to. the fact that many members saw the legislation as less than what is needed and argued instead for real reform in campaign finance.

HB 366 established revisions to the Kentucky DUIlaws. Among other constrictions, the bill provides for a blood or breath alcohol limit of 1008, requires an algendel analysis test, defines a time frame for alcohol or substance abuse programs, provides

suspension or revocation of licenses, and makes it a criminal offense to have an open container of alcohol in the vehicle. The bill was passed, partially under threat from the federal programs which the state might lose \$45 million if it didn't pass the
