One killed, others hurt in 461 wrecks

wo separate accidents in the past on Hwy, 461 in Rockcastle ty resulted in one death and two

injuries.

On Monday morning, a Flint, Michigan man was killed when he lost control of his Chevrolet Beretta crossing the center line and hitting a tractor trailer head-on.

The accident occurred seven miles south of Mr. Vernon. Last Friday, a Brochead man was scriously injured when he was involved in a three vehicle crash on 461. According to a report filed by Kentucky State Trooper John Yates, a Somersetman apparently fellacep as he travelved toward Mr. Vernon and struck two other vehicles in the southbound lane, causing the three car crash.

The most seriously injured was
Steven Lunsford, 25, of Brodhead,
whose Ford Ranger was hit head-on

In Senate budget proposal

There seems to be gridlock in Frankfort these days and it is very likely that the 2000 session of the General Assembly will end without a state budget for the next two years.
State Representative Danny Ford of Mt. Vernon, who is the floor leader for the Republican's in the house said a budget could be passed when the Geferal Assembly reconvense for its male two days on April 13 and 14, but nothing will happen unless compromises can be reached by the House. Senate and Governor's office.

Rep. Ford said this week that the main problem is that Kenutcky Governor Paul Pation wanted a huge tax increase to fuel his budget for the north of the passed of the said of the passed of the said of t

Therefore the Governor is atodds with the Republican controlled Senate and has said he would never support their budget proposal. Ford said.

The Governor issued a statement this week saying the Senate budget would cut out hundreds of thousands of dollars for Rockeastle County and millions affords the state.

"We were elected to move Ken-tucky forward, and to improve the quality of life and economic opportu-nities for all Kentuckians. Our budget proposal stands for the people and progress, the Senate republican hudget stands still," the Governor

For example, the Senate budget cut out \$1.5 million for exhibits for the Kentucky Country Music Hall of Fame at Renfro Valley, someting Ford had lobbied for.

"The house budget had already cut the \$1.5 million to \$3 million to Sauset didnot vote for the Cowenor's tax increase; Ford said.

Rep. Ford also said that it was evident that the "old buddy system" was alive and well in the House's budget proposal. "As always there were a few countiest that benefited greatly from the budget while the rest of the state got very little," Ford said.
