from coronary heart disease than people in the rest of the country. Other active areas of cardiovascu-lar research at the Medical Center

include suberoscierosis (narrowing and hardening of the arteries), treatment of heart failure through clinical trials, and studies of devices for treating heart arthythmias.

"Our research in atherosclerosis as implications not only for developing new treatments for preventing heart attacks and reducing cholesterol, but also in preventing aortic ancurysms," Daugherty said.
