Child Abuse - A Matter of Fact

Reporters of Child Abuse Are
Protected By Law

Although no statute can forbid the filing of civil or criminal charges, Kentucky law protects the reporter of suspected child abuse or neglect from any decision or award which might be sought through the filing of such a claim. Under Kentucky law, any person participating in making a report of suspected child abuse or neglect is immune from civil or criminal liability that might otherwise be

incurred or imposed as a result of such action if the reporting is done so in good faith. Therefore, in order to be immune from any civil or criminal action, the reporter of child abuse or neglect must be acting in good faith when reporting to the authorities. Any person making a report maliciously and without reason and does not believe that abuse or neglect is occurring or has occurred is not immune from civil or criminal action.

military courses and work experience, GED review classes and testing centers, and other government assistance programs which may improve higher education opportunities.

KHEAA is the state agency that administers grant, work-study, savings, Federal Family Education Loan, and scholarship programs for Kentucky students.
