Quotas for the 2000 crop year will be mailed on April 7, 2000. Leasing for the crop year 2000 will be April 10th through July 3rd. Small Grains

10th through July 3rd, Small Grains Producers growing small grains (wheat) must report their acreage by May 31, 2000. If crop acreage is not filed timely and producer applies for a Loan Deficiency Payment, then a charge of \$26.50 will be applied for a late file.

Agriculture Secretary Dan Glickman unnounced that landowners could receive more money for participation in the Conservation Reserve Program continuous signup. The new-financial incentives, totaling up to \$350 million in the Merce years, include signing bonues

ing up to \$550 million in the next three years, include signing bonuses and more money for installing and maintaining conservation practices. "Higher payments should per-suade more landowners to particisuade more landowners to partici-pate, protecting ever more environ-mentally sensitive land along streams, rivers, wetlands and public water supplies," Glickman said, speaking to the Agriculture Earth Day celebra-tion on the National Mall. "In diffi-cult economic times for farm coun-ry, this additional \$350 million will mean more cash in farmer's pock-ets."

the rule changes and incentives apply only to certain CRP continuous signup practices that generally in-clude small acreage that provide high environmental benefits because of their impact on much larger areas. Up to \$100 million in FY2000 and \$125 million in FY 2001 and 2002 will be provided in signing and practice bonuses.

Unlike the regular CRP progra Unlike the regular CRP program al-lows producers to egroll eligible highly environmentally sensitive land at anytime, without waiting for asign-up period or competing against other offers. Conservation practices pro-tect streams and rivers by keeping sediment and nutrents from entering when the water, providing eleaner drinking water, orbancing recreation and improving widdlife habitats.


