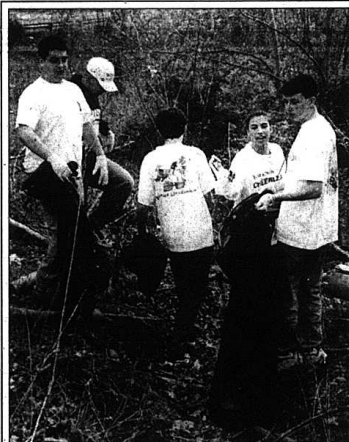

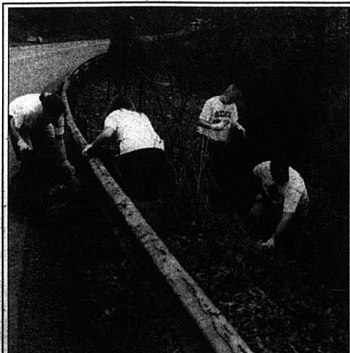

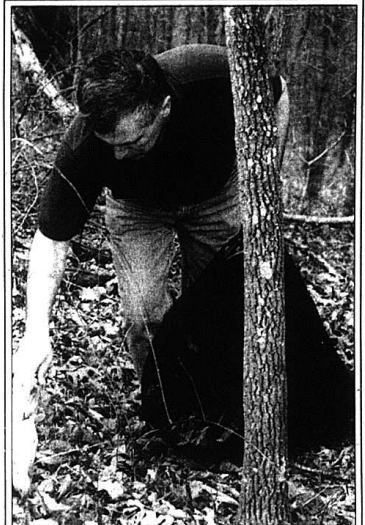
Over seventy-five bags of trash, old tires and metal were removed by the volunteers during the Pride Clean-up Day.
