Remove pillows, quilts, comforters, sheepskins, pillow-like stuffed toys and other pillow-like soft products from the crib.

Consider using a sleeper as an alternative to blankets with no other overing.

If using a blanket, put baby with his or her feet at the foot of the crib.
 Tuck a thin blanket around the crib mattress, only as far as the baby's

chest.

* Make sure your baby's head remains uncovered during sleep.

* Do not place baby on a waterbed, sofa, soft mattress, pillow or other soft surface to sleep.

New Key Forest Conservation Act Will Require Trained Loggers
