U.S. Congressman in the 5th District.

The Democrats and Republicans
will vote for a Presidential candidate,
but those winners have long been
decided, with George Bush and Al
Gore, facing off in November.

In the race for U.S. Congress,
three democrats, Jimmy "Gabe"
Turner, of Drift, Sydney Jane Bailey
Ol. Langley and Michael Vacca, Jr., of
Shelbiana will face off to see who
will run against Republican incumbent Congressman Harold "Hal"

Running unopposed on the Re-publican side are State Rep. Danny Ford, State Senator Albert Robinson and Rockeastle Circuit Court Clerk Teresa Vanzant.

Vanzant, who was appointed to fill her father's unexpired term in August of 1998, and Ford, will not be opposed in November. Robinson will face opposition from Democrat Lawrence Kuhl of London.
