Cut Large Round Bale Hay Losses

Decisions now on where and how arge round bales of hay are stored rill determine how much and what uality this winter's feed supply will e. One should also look at the

quality this winter's feed supply will be. One should also look at the financial consideration for using round bales by measuring hay losses. Studies on the weathering effects of hay stored in different ways show some interesting facts. A round bale but at it is 15 feet in diameter and 4 feet wide occupies a total volume of 64 cubic feet. With these facts in mind, what can be done to save hay? Whenever possible, store hay inside. Better quality hay and alfalfa hays should

be stored inside first. Long stem fescue will bale tighter and shed

fescue will bale tighter and shed water better.

Bale storage sites should be well de-drained. Any method such as crushed stone, poles, tires, and pallets which will keep round bales off the ground will prevent damage from ground water. Infant seats, convertible seats and booster seats are 71 percent effective in saving children's lives during an auto accident. Speakers included USDA officials, University' agricultural specialists, Food Service Directors, farm cooperative representatives, and local producers. The informational meeting explained the marketing opportunities that farmers could develop for freiph produce like fruits, vegetables and other locally grown products. Area schools, institutions and ucts. Cooks pre-pare thousands of meals daily that equire large quantities of fresh in-redients. Making growers aware of the direct marketing opportunities and the necessary criteria like quality, packaging and timeliness is the focus of the Farm-to-School Meals Initia-
