

Mt. Vernon STLP travels to Berea College

The 4th and 5th grade STLP (Student Technology Leadership Program) students have devoted many hours to learning about technology during this school year. As a learning activity, the group with their sponsors, Mrs. Becky Daugherty, Mrs. Sharon Lovell and Mrs. Joyce Lear, traveled to Berea College to explore the exciting world of computers.

The group met their tour guide, Ms. Lora Munsey, Sociology major at Berea, at 9:00 a.m. for a walking tour of the campus and a tour of the Technology and Industrial Arts Center. Dr. Alan Mahoney showed the group how computers are being used in the areas of manufacturing and industry. Dr. Mahoney demonstrated how a computer could be used to

design everything from a lamp base to an automobile. The students were then shown how the computerized design was transferred to high-tech equipment that would transform the design into an actual piece of wood or metal. The group also viewed a new type of automobile that does not have a combustible engine. Instead of a gasoline motor, the car used batteries. The group was also fortunate enough to get to see the Printing Department. Not only did they see a demonstration of making paper from recycled materials, but they also got to observe a computerized CD labeling system.

After the informative tour of the Technology center, the group visited the Geology Museum. Exhibits in-

cluded arrowheads, unusual fossils, and hundreds of different rock formations. Of special interest to the group was the display of a triceratops head.

The group was very impressed with the Focault Pendulum on display in the Science Building. This pendulum demonstrates the earth's rotation.

As with any group of students, they were especially interested in the next stop on their tour...the Cafeteria. The STLP students were impressed with the array of foods available in a school cafeteria. Most made frequent use of the ice cream section.

They also enjoyed experimenting with the various flavors of soft drinks available on site.

The tour ended with a visit to the planetarium. Here the students not only saw an interesting review of the solar system, especially of the moon, but also got to see the technology used in this setup.

This tour of Berea College was both fun and educational for the STLP students. Students were exposed to planetary science, geology, technology and manufacturing in just one visit. Not only did they learn about all of these areas, but they also got to explore first hand some areas of study available on a college campus.
