Do people who tan easily get skin cancer? Anyone can get skin cancer. However, people who have fair skin that freekles, light-called eyes, or a family or personal history of skin cancer are more likely to develop the disease. People who spend a lot of time in the sun also are more at 1risk.

Can children get skin cancer?

Most skin cancer spera after age 50, but the sun's damaging effects begin in childhood. In fact, 80 percent of a person's lifetime exposure to sun happens before age 18. For this reason, it is important to protect children from too much wow. Where on the body does skin cancer develop? Skin cancer usually appears on the areas exposed

to the sun-the face, head, neck, hands, and arms. What are the warning signs of skin cancer? The most common warning sign is a change on the skin, especially a new growth or a sore that doesn't heal. The cancer may start as a small, smooth, shiny, pale, or waxy lump. Or, it can appear as a firm red lump. Sometimes the lump cancer can slow start as a flat, red spot that is rough, dry, or scaly.
