> Fire Blight

Fire Blight is a bacterial disease affecting apple, pear, fan flowering crab apple trees, to name a few of the more common trees. How do you control Fire Blight on affected trees? Best control will occur during the dormant season. When possible, prune out blighted twigs by pruning at least 4 inches below infected areas and destroying

the clippings. Completely cover the dormant tree with a copper sulfate spray. Use 4-5 pounds copper sulfate per 100 gallons of water. This should help reduce over-wintering bacterioners who wish to do something as they see the effect of Fire Blight, two things may help. When possible, prune out blighted limbs. Prune at least 6-12 inches below effected areas and clean pruning tools between cuts by using 70% afcohol or 10% chlorine bleach solution. The second step, when possible, is to spray trees with

possible, is to spray trees with antibiotic streptomycin (Agricultural Streptomycin at farm stores). Use 4 oc. of 21% streptomycin at farm stores). Use 4 oc. of 21% streptomycin sulfate per the streptomycin sulfate per control of the streptomycin is best and again weekly during post bloom period soing as shoots continue to elongate. Streptomycin is best applied just before sundown due to the suns ability to break this product down. Pruning and spraying large trees may be impractical for some home qualified helpers who understand that Fire Blight can inadvertently be spread if proper pruning and strillizing tools are not used. Tobacco Leasing
July 3rd is the final deadline to
sign tobacco leases. Producers are
reminded leases filed and/or on file in the county office must have all in the county office must have all signatures (transferring and receiving farm) by the deadline to be approved. Leases with all signatures not obtained by the deadline shall be disapproved. If someone is growing your tobacco quota on a farm other than the farm the quota is established to remember. you MUST sign a lease in the county office by the deadline of July 3rd.

Farm Acreage Reports

Farm acreage reports of crops are
now being taken for the current year.
When all crops are planted; producers are encouraged to report all acreages of crops for history, disaster
programs and loan deficiency pro-

grams. The final reporting date for all crops, except small grains and to-bacco, is July 15th. Producers failing to file by the final reporting date will be charged a late fee.

Farm Changes Producers who have purchased or sold land need to contact the FSA office for proper reconstitution of farms. Farms enrolled with PFC have unui the deadline of June 1st to file for reconstitutions of farms. Farms not enrolled with PFC have until the deadline of July 1st. Remember to bring your deed and/or to notify the new owner to do so. Also notify this office of any and/or all address changes.
