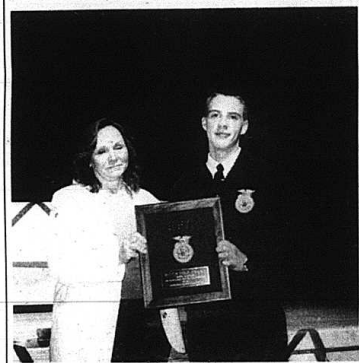
contest and in Agriculture classes. Some of the awards that were presented are as follows:
