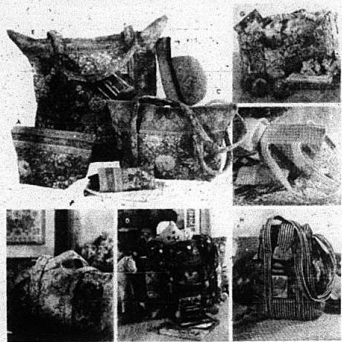

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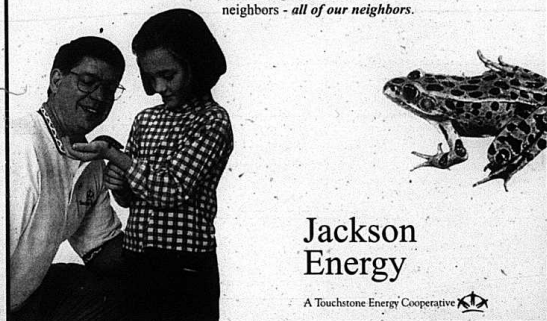
Rabbits nestle in a bed of native grasses. Butterflies flutter among a patch of wildflowers. And a mother raccoon gathers food for her babies.
