Cholesterol is a soft, fal-like substance that is found in all body tissues. Blood cholesterol levels are determined by genetic makeup and by the amount of fat in the diet. The American Heart Association recommends the following guidelines for keeping cholesterol levels low. - If you are a healthy adult over 20, test your blood cholesterol levels at least once every five years. - Earto more than 30 milligrams of cholesterol a day. (One egg yolk has about 213 milligrams of choles-
