## SCHOOL TRAFFIC GRIDLOCK IS IT A PROBLEM?

I am not referring to normal student pickup problems, but traffic of a more serious nature. Traffic that could impede the progress of emergency vehicles coming to the aid of your child.

As everyone knows, we are in new and changing times. It seems from my own personal observation that most and behaviors of our youth-change faster than Eastern Kentucky weather. One of the phenomena of today is traffic gridlock at our schools following incidents, such as natural disa bomb threats, fires, or acts of violence within the schools. There are many reasons for this: everyone see have a vehicle, large student bodies through school consolidation, instant communication through per phones, just to name a few.

On the surface this may seem manageable, until you take a deeper look at this situation. If, for exampe, Smithtown Middle School has a student body of 842 and 842 parents rush to the school when a disaster hits, there is no way to quickly move the injured from the scene to medical services. Of course, as we all know, we can add a large number of curiosity seekers to this list. I have found that within a period of time before the injured can be removed, a stage of automobile gridlock occurs around the school to the extent that ambulances cannot enter or exit. This happens within an amazingly short period of time.

What to do, or evermore importantly in this situation, what NOT to do, is vital. DO NOT RUSH TO THE SCHOOL! If your child is injured, medical personnel must have the ability to come and go quickly.

Each school district has a safety plan in place that has an alternate location to pick up your child. In the eve an emergency, please listen to your local radio station for that information.

As a parent of three children, I know how strong the urge to go to the school would be if a serious situation developed. As an experienced State Folice officer, I know that all the children will be better off if parents and curiously seekers do not rish to the school during an emergency.

If we all pull together and keep the emergency exits clear, this will provide the best opportunity for our children's safety. Rushing in and blocking the entrances would be like locking the exit doors when a fire alarm sounds.

We do not want that to happen to our children.

Dangerous clothing that can get caught in handrails, doors or other areas include:

Stay away from Danger Zones around

If you drop something near the bus, don't pick it up. The driver may not see you. Tell the driver & follow his/her instructions.

Remember that motorists don't always stop for the school bus. Use extreme caution when getting on or off the bus.
