occupational and net profits tax.

Councilwoman Clarice Kirby made a motion to extend the filing deadline each quarter by seven days, until January 1, 2001.

Jackie Renner seconded the motion, but Daugherty, Bullock and Vanhoushe did it down.

Daugherty said she thought a month was a long enough period of time for businesses to file and pay their taxes.

City Clerk Kaye Rader said last week that about 18 businesses had still not filed their tax forms with the

city, which were due on July 31st for the months of April, May and June.

Rader also said that the city had taken in about \$40,000 so far from the occupational tax.

The net profits tax on businesses will not be paid to the city until next year when those businesses file their income taxes.

Councilwoman Vanhoushe also said she thought something should be done about the poor condition in the basement of city hall where the police department has their offices.

"They have got mud down there," she said.

The council agreed to allow Water Superintendent Dennis McClure fix the problem by using a two foot drain in the parking lot.

The council also voted to waive all sewer charges for city residents that currently cannot hook to sewer.

In the past the city has charged those people, although city sewer was not available to them.

Mt. Vernon Police Chief Bill Mink told the council that city police arrested 13 people last month for driving under the influence of drugs or alcohol.

He also said that six of the city's seven police cars are now equipped with radar units and that police officers wrote 68 citations last month for speeding.

Joe McWilliams told the court his company was a nationally owned company, which would provide good service and low prices to customers in Rockcastle County.

McWilliams told the court his company wanted to get into the dumpster business so county businesses would have a choice when it came to their garbage needs.

"As it stands right now, there isn't any competition, they (BEE) have it all," McWilliams told the court.

"I have talked to a lot of business people who are very interested in what we have to offer," McWilliams said.

McWilliams also told the fiscal court that his company did business in every county surrounding

Rockcastle County.

Magistrate John Holbrook voted to give McWilliams a permit. Carlifotis seconded it and magistrate James Fred Mullins, Jr., Bill McKinney and Donald Bullock all voted no.

McWilliams seemed upset by their vote and asked the magistrates who voted no, why - but he did not get a response.

McKinney did say that large companies like Republic, which owns Laurel Garbage, usually are able to drive out the competition by charging a lot less for it.

"They make it extremely hard on the little guy. I'm not against competition, but I think there wouldn't be any if they were allowed to come to the county and I doubt they would provide the good service they say they would," he said. "You can look at their track record and in most cases they are the only game in town, so they can charge what they want," he said.

Although magistrate Jack Bradley voted for the permit, he told McWilliams that BEE had helped the fiscal court by getting into the business when no one else would. "I don't know what we would have done without them," he said.

Carlifotis also said after the meeting that if the court followed the 1990 ordinance, it was his belief that the fiscal court could not legally reject certification of a permit for any hauler meeting the county's requirements.

Laurel Garbage met all the requirements.

The court also rejected a request for a permit to haul garbage by John Perkins of Berea.

follow, we try very hard to remain focused on providing a quality education at Roundstone." Pensol said.

Roundstone students did better this year than last in every category except spelling. Overall, they scored 69.0 to Mt. Vernon's 61.4 and Brodhead's 55.7.

Roundstone's best scores came in Science where they tallied 72.3.

Mt. Vernon's scores were nearly seven points higher overall than a year ago and students there did better in every category than they did a year ago.

Mt. Vernon's best scores were also in Science with a 68.0.

Scores for students at Brodhead Elementary fell slightly from a year ago to 55.7, from 57.0.

Brodhead students did score slightly higher in four of the six areas on the test.

Brodhead students also scored the best in Science with a score of 58.8. Third graders as a whole scored fifteen points higher than the state average with a total of 70 and the state's being 55.

The third graders also scored the second highest in the region six area, of which they are included.

Russell County Schools was the only school district to score higher than Rockcastle's third graders with a score of 71.0. Other scores in the region six area are: Bell County, Adair County, Laurel County, Wayne County, Pulaski County, Madison County, Taylor County, Estill County, Whitley County, Clinton County, Lincoln County, Garrard County, Jackson County, Casey County, Clay County, Knox County, Harlan County and McCreary County.

Sixth grade students at the Rockcastle County Middle School scored lower in every area this year than they did a year ago, with the biggest drop coming in social studies where students scored six points lower this year than last.

Sixth graders scored best in language with a 50.3.

Overall, Rockcastle sixth graders scored one point higher than the region six average and two points lower than the state average of 52.0.

At the Rockcastle County High School ninth and tenth grade students both scored lower last year than a year ago.

Students in the ninth and tenth grades scored better in social studies than any other area. The ninth grade had a score of 50.3 and tenth graders scored 52.0. In both classes, it was the only area in which students scored higher than the national average of 50.

Students in the ninth and tenth grades also scored lower in math. Ninth graders fell nine and half points below the national average with a score of 39.5 and tenth graders fell eight points short of the average with a score of 42.

Scores for tenth graders fell in every area tested, while ninth graders improved in social studies and spelling.
