Signed Up For Your Free Money? Only a Few Days Left! FSA offices across the state are now accepting applications for the 2000 Tohacco Loss Assistance Program. If in the 2000 crop year-youar est a landowner with a tobacco quota, a land operator with a tobacco quota or producer who markets tobacco in your name then you are eligible to receive payment. All farms which will receive P&CP (planted or considered planted) credit are eligible due to the cut in the tobacco quotas. Planted or considered planted eredit can be received by one of the following ways:

ing ways:

1. Marketing tobacco which was grown on the farm in the 2000 crop

rown on the farm in the 2000 crop rear.

2. Marketing tobacco which was grown on the farm in the 1999 crop rear which has been held over.

3. Reporting to the FSA office the obacco acreage planted on the farm in the 2000 crop year for which there will be no marketings due to a natural

disaster.
4. Leasing the tobaccoquota away from the farm in the 2000 crop year. USDA will distribute \$340 mil-

lion to compensate tobacco farmers who suffered a reduction of tobacco quotas for the 1999-2000 crop years. quotas for the 1999-2000 crop years. Kentucky's share is S140 million. Individual farm payments for burley tobacco will be split three ways be-tween farm owners, farmers and those in control of the quotas (farm opera-tors). Payments will reach farmers between October 1-20, 2000. TLAP00 applications are avail-able at your Icoal FSA office through September 1st. Late filed applica-

tions will not be accepted. One last note-ALL OWNERS MUST SIGN note-ALL OWNERS MUST SIGN THETLAPOO application for the farm to be eligible to receive payment-even if you are getting -0-share. This pertains to husband and wife as well as other owners.

Contrary to rumors you may be eligible to receive payment even if you are not actually producing to-

Pasture Recovery
Program (PRP)
USDA's Farnice Agency
Administrator Ketth Kelly has announced that about 500 minder the
Pasture Recovery Program (PRP).
PRP was established to help farmers whose pastures were severely
amaged by drought in 1999 reestablish forage crops. Eligible land
included pasture which was notimally
grazed by livestock, but was so
amaged by drought that seeding was
required to restablish the forage crop.
County FSA offices conducted a
signup from March 20 to June 23,
2000. Producers receiving payment
must maintain the practice for a pysera preind, using the land only for
pasture-mechanical harvesting of the

Loan Deficiency Payment Producers who retain beneficial interest in a commodity eligible for a loan or a loan deficiency payment (LDP) are eligible for a payment if all of the following remain with the

for Loans and LDP's is the crop must
have been produced on a contract
acreage (AMTA), exception to soy-

beans.
A recent bill will now allow non-contractcrops to be eligible for LDP's for 2000 year only.

Change in Tobacco Loss
Payment Eligibility
Hampton Henton, I.r., State Executive Director of the Farm Service
Agency in Kentucky, announced that
the Deputy Administrator, Farm
Programs has authorized a change in policy for the Tobacco Loss Assistance Program 2000 (TLAP00).
"Late-filed spring lease and transfers of burley tobacco may now be in-

cluded in the TLAPOD payment pounds, if the lease is approved by the County and State FSA Committees," Henton said. "The request to allow these pounds to be included in the payment was made by Kentucky FSA. We feel one producer should not be penalized because another failed to sign a document timely."

fer requests with all required signa-tures before the end of the TLAP00 signup will be eligible for TLAP payment. Disaster lease and transfers

will NOT be eligible for TLAPO0 payment pounds.
Farmers with a burley tobacco quota are urged to apply at their local FSA county office as soon as possible forthe TLAPO0 payment. USDA will distribute \$340 million nationally to compensate tobacco farmers who suffered a reduction of tobacco quota or acrease for the 1999-2000. who suffered a reduction of tobacco quota or acreage for the 1999-2000 crop years.
