No charges have been filed or arrests made in the missing persons case, although several Kentucky State Police officers and members of the Rockcastle County Sheriff's office were working the case on Wednesday afternoon.

left turn lane that goes into the high school and directly into the path of the Rader vehicle, which was sitting still.

"There was absolutely nothing Kyle could do," Owens said.

Owens said there were apparently two cars sitting in the northbound lane of the by-pass and that the Henry vehicle went around both of those vehicles at the light and struck the Rader vehicle.

Both of those cars drove off after the wreck and the only eyewitnesses left at the scene were behind the Henry vehicle.

"The driver of the Jimmy said he did not know what happened," Owens said.

Kyle Rader was wearing a seat belt and received minor injuries, but his Dad was not wearing a seat belt and the Saturn did not have airbags.

Calvin Rader, did a very short time after being taken to the Rockcastle Hospital.

David Henry and his parents, Edward and Margaret, both 39, were all treated at the Rockcastle Hospital and released.

Owens said that no charges had been filed against Henry, but that an investigation into the wreck was continuing.

Visitation for Calvin Rader was held at the Dowell and Martin Funeral Home and was one of the larg-

est ever in the county.

At least 1,000 people made their way to Calvin Rader's casket. Visitation began at 6 p.m. and the last person went through line at midnight.

Calvin Rader was the ninth person killed on the by-pass from McDonalds to the traffic light on Hwy. 150, since the by-pass opened in the late 1990s.

Calvin Rader was very active in the Rockcastle County Little League program where he had coached for 20 years.

He was presently store manager at Movie Warehouse in Mt. Vernon.

"There was hydraulic fluid all over the place when we arrived," he said.

Cameron said the fire heavily damaged the machine, but it did not cause a great deal of structural damage to the plant.

"The fire never went through the roof," Cameron said.

The plant was evacuated because of the fire, but there was only one report of injury.

James Reams, 39, of London, who was apparently running the machine that caught fire, received burns to both arms. He was treated at the Rockcastle Hospital Emergency Room and dismissed.

Community Walking Program

Cumberland Valley District Health Department

The Community Walking Program is for all residents of Rockcastle County who are interested in improving their health. The goal of the program is to walk a minimum of three days a week for thirty minutes or ideally, five days a week for thirty minutes. The program will have a 12 week fall and a 12-week spring session. Participants who complete the program and sign in their walking logs will be eligible to receive incentives or prizes.

Participants will register at the Rockcastle County Health Department. Each person will receive a registration packet with a free gift and a walking log-book to track their time or mileage. At the time of registration, walkers will have their height, weight, blood pressure, cholesterol, and pulse recorded. Optional body measurements, such as circumference of chest, hips, and thighs, and arms can also be recorded. These body measurements are optional but will provide the walker valuable information and encouragement as you see positive changes in your body with a consistent exercise program. Follow-up measurements will be offered at the end of the program. *Cholesterol monitoring will have a small fee. Walking will be done at each individual's convenience, wherever he or she desires, and a headlamp is acceptable or walkers will be invited to walk as a group with a health department staff member at announced locations. Mileage or time will be documented on the hour system. At the end of the program, walkers that complete the program will be eligible to receive a T-shirt and recognition for their outstanding effort!

If you mail your form, you should contact the Health Department to find out when you can come in to pick up your Registration Packet.

(This allows approximately 3 extra weeks that could be lost to vacation, illness or inclement weather.)
