

Hunters get a chance to share their craft

This year hunters can take advantage of two special opening day dove hunts to teach a youngster how to hunt. On September 2, doves fields at the Blue Grass Army Depot in Madison County and at the Don Barnes property in McCracken County will be open only for adults and mentors, who bring along a youth 15 or under. This is the first year that a Mentor/Youth hunt has been offered in Kentucky.

The two special hunts should offer great shooting. Though the statewide dove season opens September 1, the two Mentor/Youth fields will be closed to hunting on the first day of the season. This means participants will get first crack at the birds.

"These two fields are looking very good for birds this year," says Rocky Pritchett, wildlife biologist in charge of migratory birds for the Kentucky Department of Fish and Wildlife Resources (KDFWR). "We have already been seeing lots of doves in the area."

The Don Barnes property in McCracken County has 20 acres sowed in sunflowers that will be open for hunting. The Blue Grass Army Depot has about 10 acres of winter wheat and millet that should provide an excellent field.

A few special rules apply for the Mentor/Youth hunts. Hunters must check in prior to hunting and check out prior to leaving with KDFWR staff on sight. Hunters must leave their guns at their shooting location when retrieving birds. All hunters are responsible for cleaning up their shooting location, including empty shells, prior to leaving the field. A complete list of Mentor/Youth hunt rules are listed on the back of the dove hunting regulation guide.

To assure a place in one of the hunts call 1-800-838-1549 and pre-register. Be sure to specify whether you are registering for the Barnes field in McCracken County or the

(Old Benton Road) adjacent to Clarke River and Priesters Lake.

Other public dove hunting fields and private land open through the dove field lease program are listed in the Kentucky Hunting Guide for Dove, Wood Duck, Teal, Woodcock, Snipe and Crow. Before hunting doves or other migratory birds, consult the hunting regulations guide or call 1-800-838-1549 for further information.

Blue Grass Army Depot field in Madison County. Hunters who pre-register will be mailed a copy of the Mentor/Youth rules and a map to the respective hunt field. Hunters who do not pre-register may still get an opportunity to hunt. Extra slots will be open on a first come, first serve basis on the day of the hunt.

The Blue Grass Army Depot is located on 421, south of Richmond. The Don Barnes Property is in McCracken County on Hwy. 4630

seven miles)," Carlofus said.

"Additionally, the level land at Conway and along U.S. 25 where the new interchange is being studied would probably be one of the best developable locations for businesses from Berea to London," he said.

"That project is on schedule, with construction already underway in Lincoln County," he said.

mobile home and that the woman locked the door behind him and called police.

Stewart was shot once in the upper right chest and he also received a head wound from a fragmented bullet after police arrived on the scene.

Police said that Stewart was apparently trying to steal a van and he pointed an assault rifle at them when they arrived at the scene.

Stewart was treated at the University of Kentucky Medical Center and is now being held in the Madison County Detention Center where he faces charges of kidnapping, robbery and assault in the first degree.

All three of those charges are connected with Sally Hoskins.

Rockcastle County Attorney Jeff Burdette said that Stewart, who is being held on a \$250,000 bond, is also charged with several other crimes in Madison County.

Burdette said that it was his understanding that police would present the murder case against Stewart to the Rockcastle County Grand Jury in September.
