This year hunters can take advantage of two special opening day dove hunts to teach a youngster how to hunt. On September 2, doves fields at the Blue Grass Army Depot in Madison County and at the Don Barnes property in McCracken County will be open only for adults and mentors, who bring along a youth 15 or under. This is the first year that a Mentior Youth hunt has been of fered in Kennucky.

Hunters must check in prior to hunting and check their guas at their shooting location when retrieving birds. All hunters are responsible for cleaning up their shooting location, including empty shells, prior to leaving the field. A complete list of Mentor/Youth hunt ules are listed on the back of the

To assure a place in one of the hunts call 1-800-858-1549 and preregister. Be sure to specify whether you are registering for the Barnes field in McCracken County or the

(Old Benton Road) adjacent to Clarks River and Priesters Lake. Other public dove hunting fields and private land open through the dove field lease program are listed in the Kentucky Hunting Guide for Dove, Wood Duck, Teal Woodcock, Snipe and Crow. Eric Philbeck of Mt. Verton said in a November 1994 warrant that Stewart held a pistol to Philbeck's chest and "accused me of stealing their pot."
The charge was later dropped.
