Another miracle for farmers

In the closing days of the 106th Congress, U.S. Senator Mitch McConnell scored another huge vic-tory for Kentucky's tobacco farmers. Today, McConnell inserted language in the Agriculture Appropriations Conference Report that will allow the Burley Coop to effectively wipe-out the drought-stricken 1999 tobacco crop.

McConnell, a senior member of McConnell, a senior member of the Agriculture and Appropriations Committees, urged his fellow colleagues to accept his measure to wipe out the Burley Coop's 1999 Joan with the Commodity Credit Corporation (COC). Currently, the loan exceeds \$500 million and accrue's approximately \$2 million in additional debt each month.

each month.

"This is another McConnell miracle for Kentucky tobacco farmers," said Sam Moore, president of the Kentucky Farm Bureau. "We have been pleased to work with Senator McConnell on this critical issue, we own him a huge debt of gratitude."

Danny McKinney, CEO of the Burley Coop echoed the Farm

Bureau's comments: "This is the single biggest thing that anybody could have done to help Kentucky tobacco farmers. It is simply amazing that Senator. McConnell has been able to pull another rabbit out of the bat."

McConnel added: "This is a huge victory for Kentucky' stobacco farmers. This allows the Burley Coop to Clear out its 1999 pool stock, which in turn could lead to a tobacco quota increase next year."

Kentucky tobacco farmers have been casualities in the Clinton-Gore war on tobacco. Since 1992, Kentucky tobacco farms have decreased

tucky tobacco farms have decreased from 60,000 to 45,000. In the last three years alone, tobacco quota has been cut by 65 percent. In addition to legal and political assaults on tobacco, Kentucky farms ers have suffered financial losses due to the poor quality of the 1999 crop, which was severely damaged by the drought. The inability to sell the fought-stricken 1999 crop has con-tributed to the dramatic quota cut.

McConnell's measure will help get rid of the piol stock by allowing the Copp to forfeit the 1999 tobacco crop on which the loan was made. "If the amount of tobacco in the pool stocks is notice-reased, thenour farmers will be fleaded for another devastaing cut in quote," said McConnell. "Kentucky farmers could not survive another bed year on the farm, and that's why this measure is so critical."

Will Snell, an economist at the University of Kentucky, estimates that McConnell's legislation could increase basic quota next year by as much as thirty percent.

McKinney added, "Every burley tobaceo farmer in Kentucky should thank their lucky starshat McConnell was able to deliver on this one." McConnell also thanks Congressman Ermic Fletcher for his efforts to secure support for the McConnell language in the House. "Congressman Ermic Fletcher continues to help deliver for Kentucky tobacon form." man Ernic Fletcher continues to help deliver for Kentucky tobacco farm-crs. He was instrumental in securing support for my language in the House."

The Agriculture Appropriations Conference Report must now be ap-proved by the House and Senate. Once approved, it goes to the Presi-dent for consideration.
