Since a large voter turnout is expected for this November elec-tion, the Rockcastle Board of Election Commissioners encour-ages all voters to <u>READ AND UNDERSTAND</u> the two amend-ments on this election's ballot before coming to the polls. The mendments are as follows:

Constitutional Amendment 1

"Are you in favor of amending the Constitution to establish annual sessions of the legislature, in addition to the current 60 legislative day regular session in even numbered years, by requiring the Kentucky General Assembly to meet in oddby requiring the Kentucky General Assembly to meet in our-numbered years for up to 30 legislative days during which the General Assembly may consider any issue except that the General Assembly, shall be prohibited from passing any bill raising revenue, or appropriating funds unless agreed to by three-fifths of all members elected to each house?"

"Are you in favor of amending the Constitution to abolish the Railroad Commission, and transfer its duties to another
