"What Is Written"

"What Is Written"

In Matt 17:1-9 we read about the transfiguration of Jesus. Notice vs. 23. "And was transfigured before them: and his face did stime as the sam, and his ratment was white as the light. And, behold, there appeared anto them Moves and Elhas talking with him." Now Moses and Elhas (or Elijah) represent the law and the prophets. Now let's notice a very important point from verse, 5. "White he yet speak, behold, a bright cloud overshadowed film: and behold wrice and of the cloud, which said. This is my beloved Son, in whom I am well pleased: hear ye him." What did God say! Hear yet HIEM? Not Hear yet HIM! God says we are to listen to Jesus. The problem with a lot of folks is that they want to listen to Jesus. AND Moses or the prophets of the Old Testament.
