## Courtroom is no place to honor heroes

Even as we commemorate the
1941 entrance of America into World War II this month, a few malcontents are keeping this country from saying a long-overdue thank you to the World War II generation. On November 11, even as Americans gathered

On November 11, even a Americans gathered to break ground for the much-anticated National World War II Memorial on The Mall on our nation's Capitaced National Parafestil people made plans to disrupt work on the project. They sued to delay construction well after seven years of thought and planning for the memorial.

The decision-making process encompassed I8 public hearings over the last five years - more than enough time for a good decision on the design and location. Opponents of the site and design were heard at every step. The process was fair. It's ungrateful to ask the courts to undo what a fair, open and lengthy process has determined that there is no better place than The Mall to honor the generations that preserved our freedom.

When completed, the memorial When completed, the memorial will be a lasting tribute to an entire generation, which drew strength from the very same values that inspired the colonial citizen-soldiers. The cause of democracy prevailed as a result of the unflinching courage of 16 million World War II GIs - 400,000 of whom

ave their lives in military service.

The American Legion and its af-liated organizations - The Ameri-an Legion Auxiliary and the Sons

of the American Legion - donated about \$4 million for the National World War li Memorial. The Ameri-can people exceeded the fund-rais-ing goal by a long shot, which demonstrates the people support the de-sign as well as the Rainbow Pool site on The Mall.

The memorial's design and location are appropriately first-rate. Not only will it permanently recognize the entire World War II generation that saved the world from tyranny, but it will also be a reminder of one generation's examplary devotion to principles of freedom, justice and evaulity. equality.

By its completion date, this me-

By its completion date, this me-morial will have taken more than twice as long to create as it took U.S. and allied forces to win the Second World War II. It will have taken from 1993 to 2003. That is, of course, if the project is not mirred in courtroom battles.

We have taken too long to memo-rialize our fallen World War II heroes and we have certainly waited far too long to say "thank you" to the men and women of "Our Greatest Gen-

and women of "Our Greatest Gen-eration."

Millions of our World War II he-roes have already passed on, and we lose more each day. It's time for pro-testors to leave the courtroom and to join hands and hearts with the mil-lions of their fellow Americans to pay homage while we still can. Let's emblazon our gratitude with a thank you note in stone.
