



Believe it or not, but the mail is still coming with mole cures as a result of a column I wrote about that plague several weeks ago.

I'm going to list the most popular solutions but I'm not going to name names because there was not a single solution to ridding one's property of moles that wasn't mentioned at least five or six times and some as many as 75. Besides that, if I simply mentioned everybody's name, who responded to my place for help, that would take up all the space your editor gives me.

First let me tell you the one that I tried, because it was, by far the easiest and it worked. Poison peanuts. They are available at your favorite hardware or farm supply store and even at Walmart sometimes. All you have to do is shovel down into the burrow, put a bunch of the nuts just both ends and replace the soil. Do this on every burrow you can find about every 15 feet and it'll do it all by itself. If you have a lot of moles, you may need three or four cans.

I believe the trick is to founder them all at once. Because if only one or two get poisoned the ones that are left won't fool with the peanuts anymore. You need to try and make it so that every mole on the property has a chance to die. Within days of putting out the peanuts, I could literally walk around my yard and smell "em dead and there's not a sign of a mole hill on my property now. Surprisingly, only a handful of writers had tried this solution and they all claimed it worked. It did for me, at least for the time being.

The most popular solution came from dozens of folks who insist that you plant mole beans, also known as dog tick and castor bean. I tried this with no noticeable difference in my yard except that it contained very tall, very ugly plants and they should be advised that the beans are deadly poison to humans or any other warm blooded animal that might get hold of them.

Lots of people suggested buying a \$30.00 trap that is spring loaded and tripped by a trigger that you stick down into the burrow. The mole comes along, is the trigger and the trap shoots a spring into him. I once had three traps into him to my knowledge, I never once harpooned a mole. I don't even think I ever brought blood.

Several people recommended blowing sulfur smoke back into their burrows with a hair dryer. This is accomplished by putting a couple of hot charcoal blocks back into the burrow, dishing on a couple tablespoons of sulfur and then sticking the hair

dryer, turned up high as she'll run, back into the burrow. Similarly, several folks suggested duct taping a piece of flexible pipe extended off the tail pipe of an automobile and getting them with carbon monoxide. Mark this up as another creative use of duct tape.

Chewing gum, specifically juicy fruit, was suggested by numerous writers who claim that the moles eat it and die of constipation. Again you are supposed to put it back in the holes and let nature run its course. One writer insisted that teaberry wafers better than juicy fruit.

A few folks suggested fire. Trench the burrows down as flat as you can and when you see the earth move as a mole tries to open his hole back up, fire several rounds with a 22 rifle into the ground.

There were some suggestions for rigging up a means to electrocute moles which we will not mention in this column because we do not want to be defendants in a lawsuit should the process get messy and the person attempting wind up flying himself. Although recommended, we also do not endorse the use of fire combined with gunpowder or gasoline.

Several folks had remedies that did not involve killing the moles. An eight ounce bottle of castor oil mixed with two gallons of warm soapy water poured randomly atop the burrows supposedly gets messy and the person attempting wind up flying himself. Although recommended, we also do not endorse the use of fire combined with gunpowder or gasoline.
