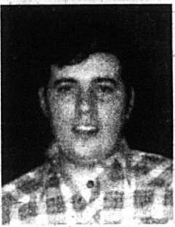


Bonnie Parsons

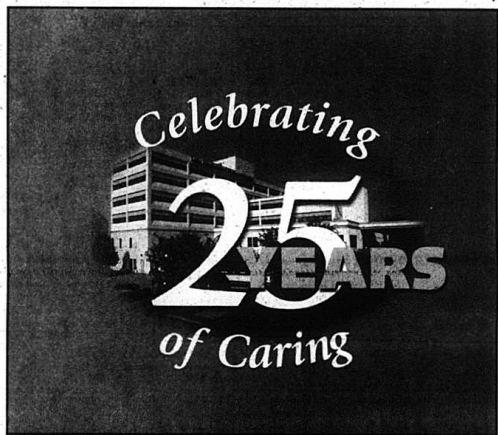
