New program launched

The Rockcastle County School District presents Job Quest, a program that will assist teens and young adults throughout the community in personal development and setting career and education goals.

Rockcastle County Schools received an \$88,679 grant to serve forty in-school youth and \$23,699 grant to serve ten out-of-school youth.

Job Quest is designed to serve 14 to 21 year olds who are unsure about their future after high school; who want to plan for their future after high school while contributing to the community; who are thinking about a career, but unsure where to start; who have dropped out of high school and those who know what they want to be, but need assistance in reaching that goal.

Job Quest will provide work experience, academic enrichment, leadership development, supportive services, along with the development of a systematic career plan.

Not only will Job Quest provide benefits to youth, but the community and its employers as well. Employ-

ers of Job Quest participants can receive paid work-based learning (w-its limited slots available), tax credits on new hires, save money on the cost of hiring, and be provided with a qualified workforce.

"The community will benefit through the development of disadvantaged youth and the building of a bridge between the community and its youth," said Project Director Jenny Sweet.
