ished by NASCAR on Saturday night for breaking a strict racing rule and ignoring a black flag in the final laps of the Pepsi 400. Stewart, who drew the black flag for driving below the yellow line on the race track, was docked 20 finishing positions--a pun-ishment that cost him 65 points in the

Long before the punishment was Long before the punishment was announced, an angry Sewart rick to affigue his case with NASCAR officials But he was rebuffed in his effort to approach Winston Cup director Gary Nelson at the NASCAR hauler and had to be restrained by car owner Joe Gibbs and his crew chief. Stewart also slapped a reporter's tape recorder away and kicked if under alear. Gibbs then went into the NASCAR hauler to speak to Nelson as the on-track incident was reviewed.


