While all of the things Autoliv demonstrated would contribute to lowering the injury value numbers, there is no rush to incorporate them into the present NASCAR safety re-quirements.

Teams simply haven't budgeted for safety testing, and NASCAR isn't ready to order any design changes to

ready to one.

"In the past, there hasn't been any formalized process, even though there's been a tremendous emphasis on safety," said Jim Hunter of Lowe's Motor Speedway. "Everybody has

been out sort of doing their own thing. NASCAR's role in this process is to formalize it and figure out who pays and how much." Meanwhile, NASCAR has yet to

mandate either of the driver head-re-straint devices, even though 75 per-cent of Winston Cup drivers are now
