New legislation required all farms with an effective quota greater than zero to file an initial designation of pounds to a specific swarehouse, re-ceiving station or dealer with which they intend to market their tobacco nd to m arket th

they intend to market their tobacco form F8A 808 by the deadline of August 1, 2001.

Compensation from the Trust would be made only for the years in which an applicant had a vested interest in tobacco produc-tion, as described under previous com-
