#### Junie Kirby arrested on drug charges

A Rockcastle County man who shot and killed his pregnant girlfriend in 1995 has been arrested on drug

in 1995 has been arrested on drug charges.

Wally 'Junie' Kirby, 44, of Castle Village Apartments Brodhead was arrested on Monday and charged with manufacturing methamphetamine.

Kirby and his current girlfriend Juniain McCormick Walkins, 30, also of Castle Village Apartments, were arrested on Monday by Brodhead City Police Officer William Harris.

Harris arrested the two after the Rockcastle 911 dispatch received a complaint.

Harris said that when he arrived at Castle Village, Kirby and Watkins were apparently making the lilegal drug methampfteamine in a wooded erase behind the apartment complex and that they'had several of the ingredients used to make the illegal drug in their car.

While Harris was searching Kirby's vehicle he came across a milk jug that Kirby told Harris had milk in it.

Harris said that when he opened the jug it actually was a type of ammonia used to make the illegal drugs and that Harris was overcome by the

Harris was admitted to the Rockeastle Hospital, where he was retuend for the affects of the amonia. Harris was kept overnight at the hospital and will not return to work until this Friday.

When Kirby appeared in court on Wednesday he was found in contempt of court by District Judge Mike Henry for disrupting court and his case on the charges of manufacuting meth were not beard, our ton September Libn less is eving held on a \$50,000 cash bond.

Kirby pled guilly in 1998 to second degree manulaughter and recived a sentence of five years in prison for the February 24th, 1995 shooting death of Tracy Caudii, 22, of Orlando.

Caudill was carrying the couple's second-child when she was shot. ## **Fiscal Court** takes over ownership of former school

The Rockeastle County Fiscal
Court voted last week to take overownership of the former Livingston
Schööl property and to begin the necseasyr steps to put it back in condition for public use.
The school was closed in 1994 by
the Rockeastle County Board of Education and has deseriorated and been
heavily vandelized.
Daniel Boone Development Corporation bought the property in 1996
hanks to a 542,000 state grant, but no
work has been done on either structure.

Following is a time line of events surrounding the Livingston School: 1994:Rockcastle Board of Edu-cation close the Livingston School. 1994-1996: Livingston School property continues under ownership of the Board of Education. Board of Education becomes concerned about the future use of the structures and

the future use of the structures and the property's synadalism.

1996: Daniel Boone Development Board, Inc., with main office in Manchester, looks over the buildings and seeks ownership of the property. By state law, the School Board cannot hand over the property without just compensation.

July 1996: State Representative Damy Ford provides \$42,500 state finding to Daniel Boone Development Council, Inc., to purchase the Livingston School property from School Board. Transaction is com-
