

Now therefore Be it Tordined by the City of MI. Vermon, Kentucky as follows:

Section One: Tax Levy - motor vehicles

Saction One: Tax Lary - motor vehicles and motorbook and et al. 167 cents on each \$100.00 (one hundred dollars) as-sessed value of motor vehicles and motorboots subject to taxation under the laws of the State of Kentucky is hereby levied for city purposes. Saction Two: Due Date, Payment and Panalty

hicles and motorboats shall be collected by the Rockcastle County Clerk in ac-cordance with the provisions of KRS cordance with the provisions of KRS 134.800 and other applicable statutes. B. Ad valorem taxes on motor wehicles and motorboats shall become due and delinquent as set farth in KRS 134.810 and such taxes not pold when due shall be subject to the penalty and interest as specified therein.
