Thousands of invisible potential enemies to good health live and thrive in our homes. In draperies, carpets, bedding and furniture, we can find indoor allergens such as dust mites, ragweed pollen, mold, mildew, smoke, and animal dander.

Advancements in vacuum cleaner filters that target these particles have been a boon to people who suffer from allergies and asthma.

High Efficiency Particulate Air filters are one of these

High Efficiency Particulate Air filters are one of these improvements. The goal of HEPA filters is to collect as many contaminant particles as possible by retaining dirt and dust particles, along with other irritants such as pollen, dust mites and smoke. Manufacturers claim HEPA filters will trap more than 99 percent of all particles as small at 0.03 microns in size. Dust mites and ragweed pollen size. Dust mites and ragweed pollen are relatively large at five microns.

As we've become more concerned with air pollution in our home HEPA has been the watchword on air filter and vacuum cleaner bags. For best particle retention, look for the words "true HEPA sealed filtration."

New bagless vacuum cleaner models remove particles from the vacuum exhaust using second filter

Remember to replace these filters before they fill up with dirt and dust.

Vacuum more than once a week if family members suffer from allergies. Heavy traffic areas should be vacuumed daily. Areas with less traffic can be vacuumed onee a

Carpets are reservoirs for Carpets are reservoirs for allergens. For the most thorough allergen removal, use a vacuum cleanire with a motorized carpet cleaning brush attachment. It vibrates soil at the carpet backing loose, bringing it closer to the surface so suction removes it from the carpet. Non-powered carpet attachments only suction off surface soil.

In addition the carpet, regularly vacuum pillows, draperies, bedding and fabric furniture. Also, clean ards because dust mites mold thrive in moisture that

and mold thrive in moisture that builds up along these areas. To keep your home free of pollens that can trigger health problems, keep windows and doors closed during the fall allergy season. Remember also to clean hard surfaces to remove pollen.




