Health official tells lawmakers anthrax fears must be kept in perspective

fears must be kept in Though bioterrorism scares have rompted a growing number of calls to authorities about suspicious mail, packages and powders, no anthrax has been found in Kentucky, one of Kentucky's top health officials assured lawmakers during yesterday's meeting of the General Assembly Health and Welfare Committee.

"The biggest public problem at this time is the fear and anxiety associated with the presence of an unknown threat. People are just plain scared," said Dr. Rice C. Leach, Commissioner of the Department for public Health. As a result, the response system is receiving many calls for situations that could have been handled with far fewer resources if folks had used more common sense to begin with. Leach noted that in recent years, authorities have been trained to respond to bioterrorism according to a hypothetical scenario in which people in a single location were exposed to a pathogenic organism. But the anthrax scares of recent days are different, with a number of different reports of suspected bioterrorism

Every letter or powder should be evaluated, but not every one needs to be managed as a hazardous material exposure or a serious crime requiring the FBI to re-

spond."

* It's OK to toss out unopened

Not all powders need a police investigation.
If the mail looks suspicious to you don't open it. Call 911 and ask someone to pick it up.
If you find spilled powder, a blend of 1 part bleach in 10 parts water will kill bacteria. Thar's what laboratories use to clean anthrax spills.
