\$3.25 million secured for **Daniel Boone Forest**

U.S. Representative Harold "Hal' Rogers says a House-Senate conference committee has given its final approval to more than \$3.25 million for land acquisition, recreation improvements and law enforcement efforts in Kennucky's Daniel Boone National Forest. The funding is provided in appropriations legislation that sets the budget for U.S. Forest Service programs in the coming fiscal year. The legislation should be approved by the Congress as early as next week.

"The Daniel Boone National Forest is key to our efforts to boost our time in this region, so it is important that we provide this federal invalvement in the forest," Rogers said to-day, "This funding will provide now law enforcentient resources to the forest-protecting visitors and working, to eradicate marijuana cultivation in the Daniel Boone, Funding is also available to acquire new land from willing sellers along the Red River Gorge and the Rockeastle Rivier Gorge and the Rockeastle Riving to the seller than the red to the r We've also secured the funding to complete the new visitor center project at Gladie Creek. We're mak-ing a substantial federal investment in the Daniel Boone National Forest.

That's good news for our-region's tourism economy."


Rogers has secured \$500,000 to fight marijuana culvivation in the forest. The program, which Rogers has supported for four consecutive years obtaining a total of \$2.25 million in declard funding, has resulted in handreds of arrests and prosecutions and yielded tons of the illegal crop.

The legislation also includes \$2,037,000, secured by Rogers, for the Daniel Boone National Forest to acquire about G000 acres of adjacent lands from willing sellers. Lands near hexenic RedReiver Gorge in Powell, Menifee and Wolfe counties, and along the Rockesside River in Laurel, Rockesside, Pallaski, and Jackson in federal fundies for the acquisition effort.

Rogers has also secured \$718,000 in federal funds to complete work on a tourism and environmental education center at the Gladic Creck Historic Site on the Red River Gorge.
