And let's bring back the House and Senate Committees on Un-American Activities. Congress must again accept its Constitutional mandate to foster the security of our nation. This must include not appointing to Security and Intelligence Committee those members who are known to be security risks.

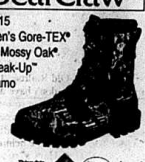

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"What Saith the Scriptures"

Last week we noticed from 1 Thess. 5:23, "I pray God your whole spirit and soul and body be preserved blameless unto the coming of our Lord Jesus Christ" that man has 3 parts, body, soul and spirit. We discussed last time, the physical side of man, his body, the outward man.

Man also has "soul" that is, animal life, vitality. Notice in Genesis 2:7, man became a living soul. The same word is used again in Genesis 2:19, "And out of the ground the LORD God formed every beast of the field, and every fowl of the air; and brought them unto Adam to see what he would call them: and whosoever Adam called every living creature, that was the name thereof." That phrase living creature is the same word as in Gen. 2:7, living soul. Man has "life, breath, vitality" just like the animals. As animals live and breathe in the world, so do we, and thus we have this in common with the animal creation. But sometimes in the scriptures though, soul is used to refer to the inward man, that which is made in the image of God. Soul and spirit can be used as synonyms, but when used together the word soul refers to animal life and spirit refers to inward man that is made in the image of God. Next week we shall talk about the spirit of man.

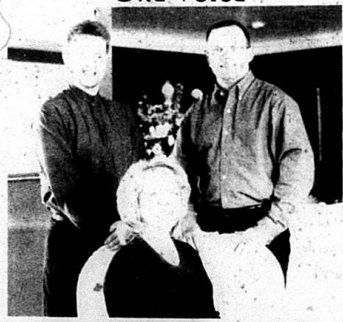
