The court system has 26 lj judges, 3300 employees and an annual budget of over \$200 million. "My role as Chief Justice has allowed me to improve the structure and function of Kennicky courts. dents chosen for the Strasbourg pro-gram last term, based on faculty rec-ommendations and expectations of academic promise and social matu-rity. She remained there for the entire fall term, completing formal class work and taking advantage of travel opportunities in France and other

Mark Rasmussen of the Centre faculty is assigned to live in France for the fall term, teaching class and coordinating field trips and travel programs.

The students spent the term study-ing the history and culture of France and Medieval Europe, including the literature and art. During their stay in Strasbourg, the group experienced a visit to Paris, the Chartres Cathe-

dral, visits into Germany and s rounding European countries and an overnight stay in the Vosges Moun-

Centre considers international education to be important, and the college maintains residential over-


college maintains residential over-seas programs in England, Japan and Latin America, along with the pro-gram in France.
