ORDINANCE #1-03 CITY OF BROADHEAD, KY.

An ordinance of the City of Broadhead, Kentucky, amending provisions of existing ordinances as to water and sewer rates.

The Council of the City of Broadhead, Kentucky, do hereby enact as follows: That section 2 of an ordinance of the City of Broadhead, Kentucky, enacted 1/21/03 and amendments thereto, enacted 1/21/03, be amended as follows:

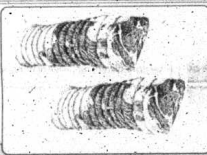
Now, therefore, be it ordained by the Council of Broadhead, Kentucky that this water sewer rate amendment ordinance be in effect upon 2nd reading and publication.

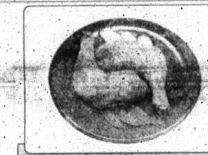
