I am impressed with the spirit of sacrifice on the part of the early saints, which is an out growth of their brotherly love. "And all that believed were together, and had all things common: And sold their possessions and goods, and parted them to all men, as every man had need." Acts 2:44-45. A little later on we read, "Neither was there any among them that lacked, for as many as were possessors of lands or houses sold them, and brought the prices of the things that were sold, and laid them down at the apostles' feet: and distribution was made unto every man according as he had need. And those who by the apostles was named Barnabas, (which is, being interpreted, The son of consolation,) a Levite, and of the country of Cyprus. Having land, sold it, and brought the money, and laid it at the apostles' feet." Acts 4:34-37. This is the only workable form of communism, a voluntary type, for this was done out of love. Acts 5 points out that such actions were not required or forced, "Whiles it remained, was it not thine own? and after it was sold, was it not in thine own power?" vs. 4. May we be encouraged by the example of these folks, "and to remember the words of the Lord Jesus, how he said, It is more blessed to give than to receive." Acts 20:35.
