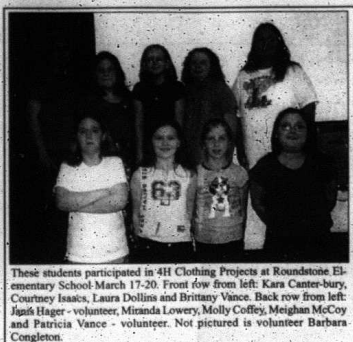

"What Saith the Scriptures"

In Romans 1:3-4 we read, "Concerning his Son Jesus Christ our Lord, which was made of the seed of David according to the flesh; And declared to be the Son of God with power, according to the spirit of holiness; by the resurrection from the dead:" Paul in these 2 verses affirms the dual nature of Jesus Christ.
