Several reports have been made that at least seven officers with the department-area-in-Rockcastle to check for illegal hunters and to observe any hunting activities, including hunting over "baited reas."

A "baited area" means an area where feed, grains or other substances capable of luring wild turkeys have been placed. A person shall not hunt on a baited area or by the aid of baiting while the bait is present, or

fide agricultural practices.


