

119 at MVES participate in Six-Flags Reading Club

This spring students at Mt. Vernon Elementary participated in the Six Flags Six-Hour Reading Club sponsored by the Six Flags theme parks and Mrs. Sharon Lovell, our Library Media Specialist. To participate, each student read a total of six hours during a two-week time period. The reading material could be newspapers, books, magazines, even Bible stories, as long as the reading material was not a school assignment. The choice of reading material was left up to each individual child. 199 students completed the required six hours of reading.

The reward for this reading was a free ticket to a Six Flags theme park valued at \$20 each. Classroom teachers, who assisted with the program, also received a free ticket, valued at \$35. The students and faculty at MVES earned a total of \$3,325 in free tickets. The ticket is valid from June 14 to August 3, 2003 for one day's admission to any of the Six Flags theme parks.

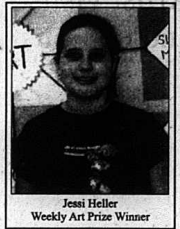
