Comets hold competition

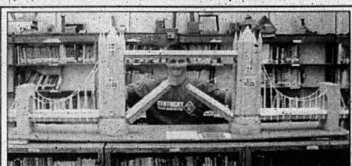

Each participant was permitted to choose a unique building from around the world and then construct a scale model of the building, including specific characteristics. No guidelines were placed on the materials to be used or on the amount of time the students could work on the projects. All projects were due April 15th and have been on display since in the library at RCMS.

The student body, along with staff and visitors, were permitted to vote on the projects in four different categories. The group category winners were Jill Owens and Megan Bradley, with their model of Saint Basil's Cathedral in Moscow, Russia. They will each receive a \$20 gift card.

Individual winner was Josh Renner with his scale model of the Seattle Space Needle. Josh will receive a \$25 gift card.

The bridge category winner was Donovan Pigg with his elaborate model of the Tower Bridge in London, England. Donovan's bridge is a fully functional drawbridge and also won him the Best of Show Award and a \$40 gift card.

These models represent the high quality of performance that all Rockcastle County students can achieve if given the opportunity. 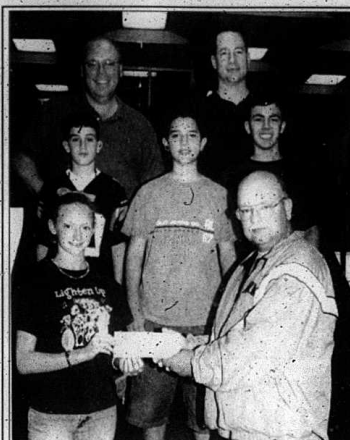
Donovan Pigg won the bridge category with his elaborate model of the Tower Bridge in London, England.
