Statistics have shown that even what we consider. To be good changes, such as a ensise in pay or moving to a nicer home, are great enough stresses that illnesses are more likely in the following year. There is also evidence that stress significantly increases irregular heart beats, raises the blood pressure and even affects our ability to fight cancers. Some studies have shown that tumor cells grew faster in patients who were under stress—the defenses against tumor cells appeared to be decreased. Sudder feasth from irregular heart hythms has been reported to be more common in people under psychological stress. Blood pressure readings are higher when a person is under stress, and there are even reports that diabetes and some forms of arthritis can be related to stress. Just where this will end on one knows, but we do know that for a happy and healthy life it is good to keep stresses to a minimum.
