Don't miss the first annual Garden Show, sponsored by the Rockcastle County High School Band.

The event will be held June 13 and 14 and will feature ten beautiful gardens.

One stop on the tour will be the shady backyard retreat at the home of Allen Pensol of 30 Lovell Lane. This attractive, and low-maintenance garden, offers a cool refuge from the summer sun. A key element of this garden's charm is the collection of "old fashioned" plants from relatives and friends. The cigar plant, with its unique bloom, brings back memories of his childhood visits to his grandparents' home in Georgia. A rustic fence, with flowering vines, surrounds the garden. Broad stepping stones, with lush green Vinca wandering throughout, make access to this tiny oasis easy for visitors to enjoy. Hanging baskets and pots with flowering plants add color and interest to this inviting garden.

Another stop on the tour will be The Lambert Walk at Stewart Garden, located behind the Rockcastle Hospital. This newly-created garden features a paved pathway that winds beneath a canopy of mature evergreen trees. The quarter of a mile pathway, which leads to a gazebo, is lighted at night for staff and patients to enjoy. Plants were selected to give this garden a cool appearance. Assorted Hostas provide broad leaves with varying green shades, while flowering shrubs, such as Azaleas and Rhododendrons, bring a smattering of color. Don't miss this unique opportunity to explore this tranquil addition to the hospital grounds.

The show concludes with a Garden Tour, featuring refreshments and

music by members of the RCHS Band. Free transportation to garden sites will be provided by R-Tec. One ticket includes admission to all gardens both evenings. Those wishing to take a self-guided tour are welcome.
