Preventing Migraines

Migraines can be prevented in two different ways. The first is to
avoid the foods, stresses, and changes in life that can trigger the headaches. The other is to use a medicine prophylactically to-decrease the frequency and seventy of the.

Foods that should be avoided include chee Foods that should be avoided include cheeses, red wines, cured means, pickled foods, alcohol and caffeine. Food additives such as nitrates and mono-sodium glutamate (MSG) should also be avoided. Stresses in life, irregular delearly habits, and lack of sleep or even excessive sleep can trigger mi-graines. A person should strive to maintain a regu-lar routine; meals and sleep patterns should be kept consistent.

Medicines can be very useful in treating migraines. They can be used prophylactically to prevent migraines; or started at the very first sign of a headache to abort the headache. When abortive medicines are used, it is very important to start them immediately at the onset of a migraine; Prophylactic medicines have been very popular and there are many-to choose from. They are usually started if the frequency of the headaches and their-effect on your daily life warrant their use.

Prophymolo is a blood pressure medicine that is often the first choice. It is safe and can be taken once-a-day. Another category of blood pressure medicines, called the calcium channel blockers, provides useful provident medicines.

There are also several other choices for migraine prophyslaxis. If graines affect your life, it may be time to discuss it with your doctor.
